• **KEY ISSUES**

- Twyfords has been engaged to provide community engagement and facilitation services to deliver the project.
- The majority of the consultation list below participated in a planning workshop on 30 January 2013 to inform Twyfords' development of the proposed community engagement approach and framework for the project.
- The proposed approach has also been informed by the *Living in Brisbane 2026* vision experience.
- To develop and deliver a long term vision incorporating regional-specific aspirations and priorities, that is genuinely "owned" by Queenslanders, a grassroots co-define—co-design—co-determine engagement approach is proposed.
- Based upon advice from your office, and from Twyfords, a proposed community engagement process is presented for your consideration.
- The process is framed around the following milestones:
 - o 26 February 2013 – you make a keynote speech in Townsville announcing the engagement approach and first summit/event
 - o 6 March – briefing sessions for all MPs on the process, where they will be provided with information, tools and templates to assist engagement

- April 2013 – the first statewide summit with a co-define and co-design focus – a 400-500 participant event in Mackay.
 - April onwards – three month period for grassroots local engagement and consultation activities sponsored/facilitated by MPs, including a keynote event in each electorate that a Minister would attend, with parallel statewide consultation and engagement activities, including with peaks and their sectors, and the Queensland Public Service.
 - To manage MPs workloads and ensure that all material provided is captured during the consultation process, respondents will be encouraged to provide their responses to central email and postal addresses
 - Second statewide synthesis summit to co-determine key elements of the vision and priorities – a 400-900 participant event held in August in Brisbane.
 - Cabinet approval of the final suite of documents and associated collateral material to support public release, in late November.
- Your direction is also required about a range of other matters outlined in **Attachment 2**.
 - Briefing of both government and non-government MPs — including an invitation to be involved in a bi-partisan community engagement process — is recommended. It is proposed that an invitation be sent to all MPs on the 26 February, to attend a briefing at Parliament House on 6 April, during the Parliamentary sitting week.

It's an opportunity to talk about the priorities and the trade-offs and where we want the state to be.

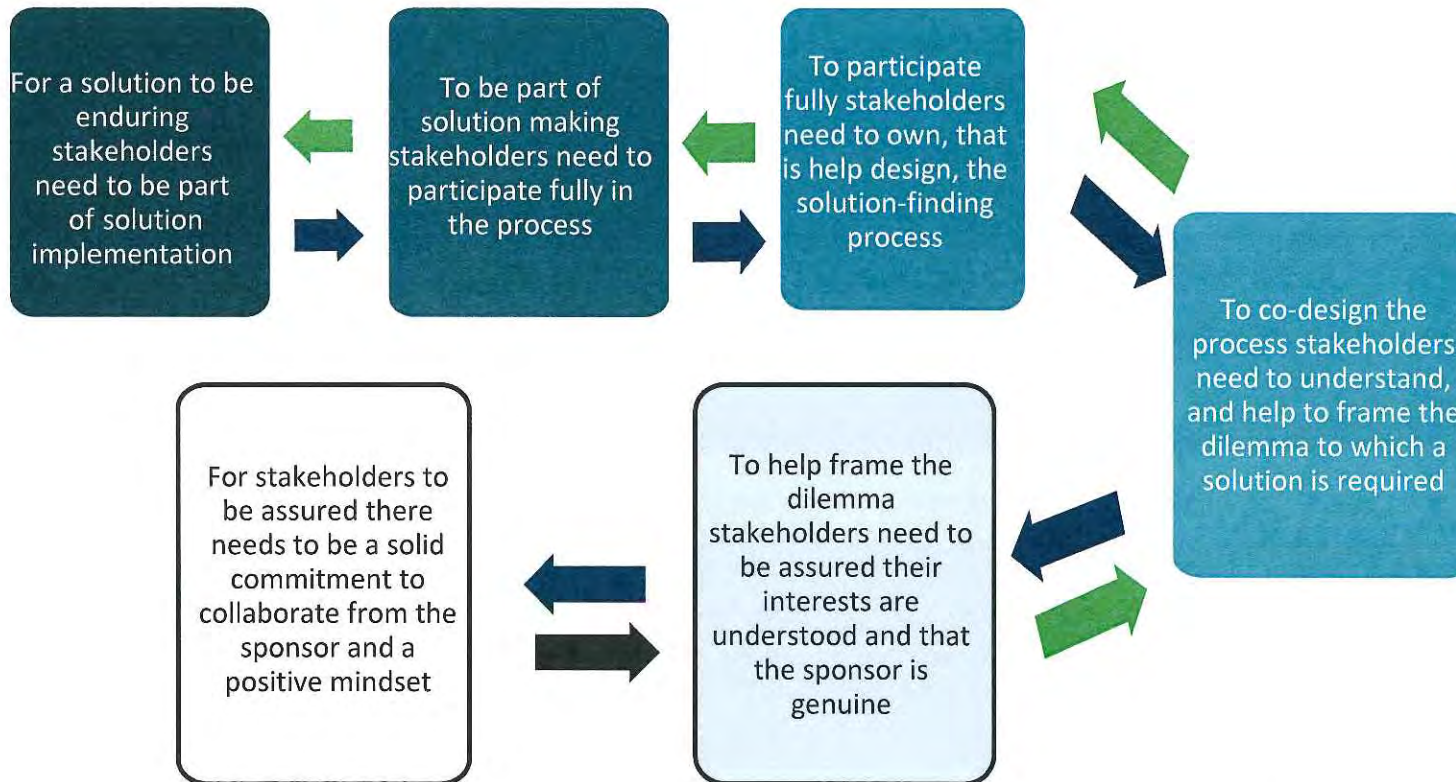

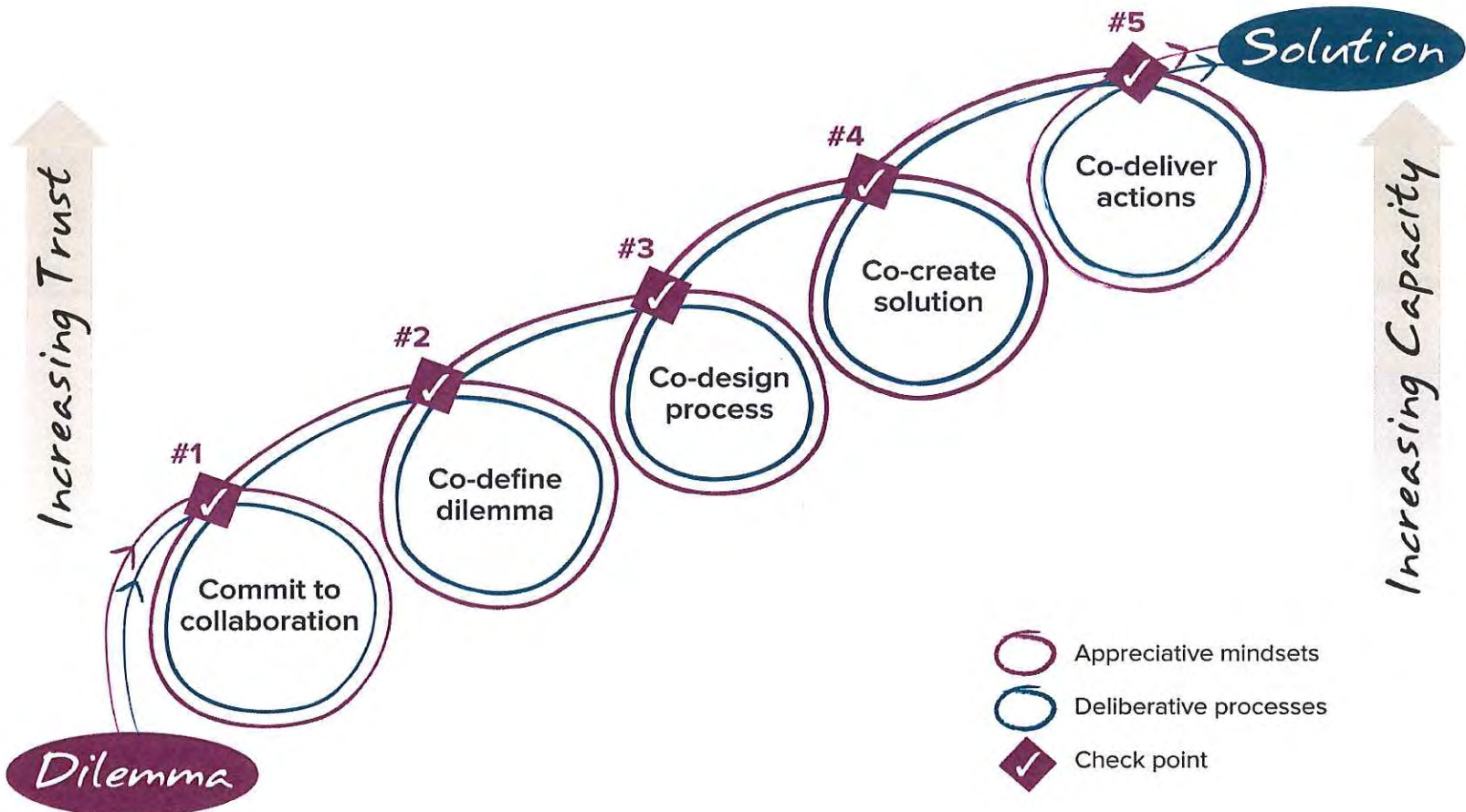

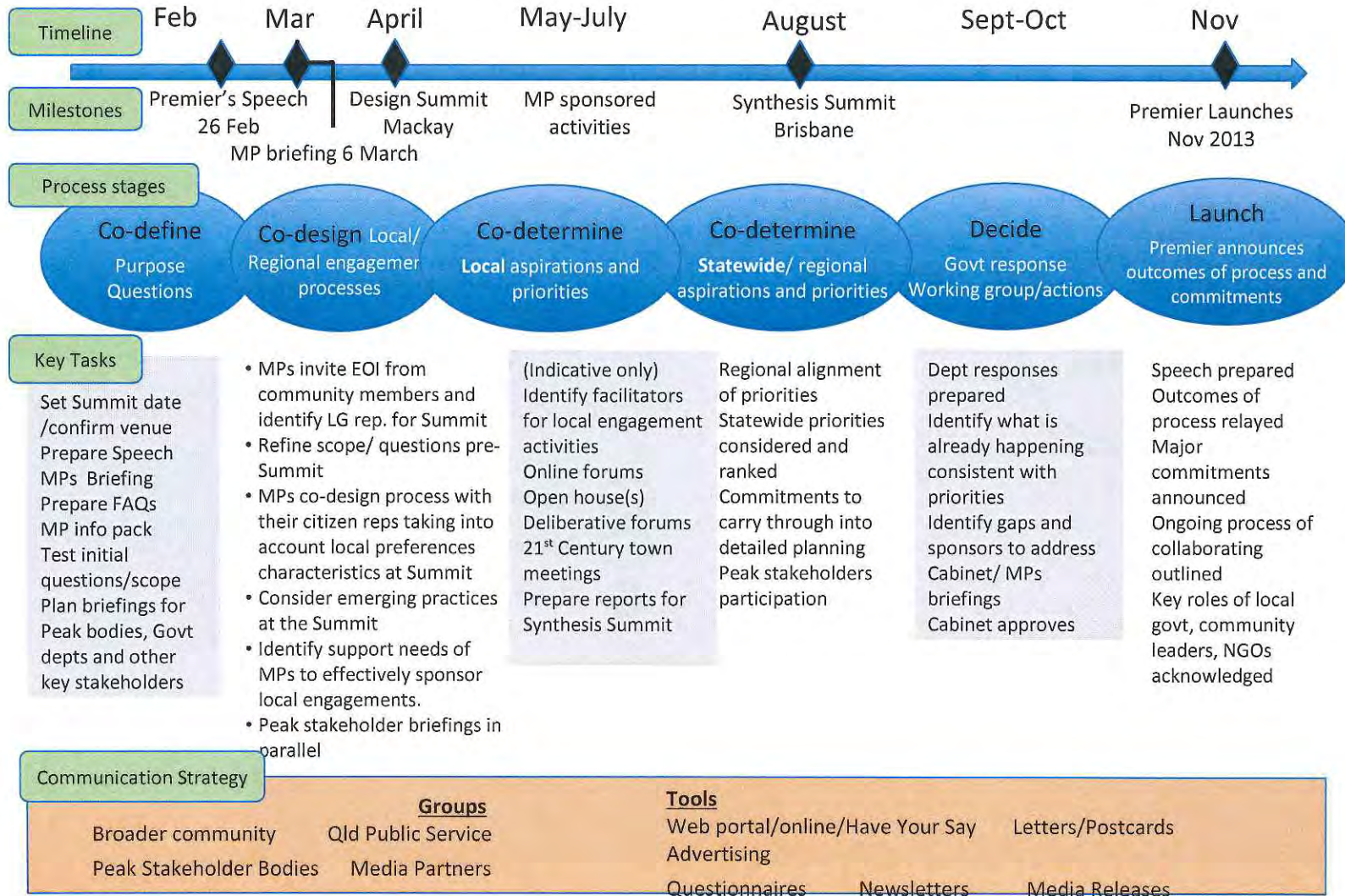

Dear Councillor de Wit

On 15 January 2013 I announced that the government will work with Queenslanders to develop a 20 year vision for our State, created by Queenslanders, which will reflect the views of all of us on the key issues, challenges and opportunities, and our aspirations for our shared future.

This vision will be created through a state-wide staged, facilitated engagement process, which will take place over most of this year. It is my hope that through this process we can develop a vision for Queensland that captures the widest range of views and is shared across the State, but that also has regional and local relevance and concrete applications.

As I said on 15 January, this will be a state-wide dialogue and process to develop a proper vision. It will not be an imposed vision, but a process involving the whole community. The engagement process is arguably more important than the outcome itself, because the community is going to create the plan. I want the community to take the lead in developing the vision, and I want to invite Mayors and local government councillors, as community leaders, to have active roles in facilitating the process.

As such, I invite the Local Government Association of Queensland (LGAQ) to be a key partner in this process, and to work with Regional Organisations of Councils (ROCS), Mayors and councils to advance this project. I will establish a small project team within the Department of the Premier and Cabinet to coordinate the consultation and engagement process. You may consider that it would be useful to second an LGAQ officer to the project team, to support this partnership between the Queensland Government and the LGAQ to deliver this exciting project.



Hi Craig and Michael

John and I gave some thought to what we believed were some key messages for MPs and Cabinet. Some may feel we are telling them to 'suck eggs' but this is what we put to any execs and decision-makers. Something important to consider, and to be reminded about.

Essentially this is a great opportunity - but there are risks as well.

What are the risks?

- * Seen as just a 'talk-fest' - lots of activity with no outcomes.
- * Seen as just a political exercise to generate positive publicity
- * Process dominated by usual suspects and/or mates of the LNP
- * That LG and state depts feel their other planning/engagement efforts have been disregarded and/or unappreciated (and therefore they don't engage or support the process)
- * That the process is seen as an opportunity to generate a shopping list for govt to respond to - and therefore raises expectations unhelpfully, and detracts from the message that this is a long term plan for all of Qld - not a wish a list for present government.
- * That the process provides a platform for those who want to push other issues/interests

Some do's and don'ts

- Don't
- * Pretend that it is uncool or weak to ask for help to articulate a vision and focus on priorities
 - * Dominate conversations and try to impress people with how much you know
 - * Pretend there is a blank canvass - things are already happening and govt is already committed to certain directions/programs
 - * Just talk to/involve people who are easy to work with - or who agree with you/support you. (Diversity is good!)
 - * Just go through the motions (if it's evident that you think the process is a waste of time - it WILL become a waste of time)

Do

- * Develop questions, with others, that you are seriously about - ones where you are seeking answers for drawing on the collective wisdom of your constituents.
- * Listen much more than you talk.
- * Appreciate the efforts of LG and govt departments who have already been engaging and planning. We build on such efforts.
- * Reinforce that this is a process that requires responses from all Queenslanders - not just about what State Govt will do. It's about LG, NGOs, Business etc. Govt doesn't hold all the levers, have all the resources, or all the answers. But we are committed to helping us all work together to achieve shared goals etc.
- * Expect to learn something new.
- * Appreciate input and let people know that it's helping to shape a stronger future for Qld.
- * Seize opportunities to co-define the important questions, and co-design the process for exploring those questions. This is what builds trust in the process.
- * Ask for support when you need it.

Craig, Andrew, Michael,

As I mentioned in our call, Max and I have given some thought to a process around the co-define element, seeking a balance between providing certainty and a framework, without providing the answer. It could start immediately, and run in a number of iterations until the April event.

The value is the opportunity for careful consideration by each group (eg, Cabinet, MPs, opposition/independent MPs, DGs) of what is intended, and the generation of the draft focus questions by listening to all the key perspectives, and providing a context for those questions (ie, we are not going in with a blank canvass). So we go into the April workshop with some well tested Queensland wide focus questions for validation by the representative stakeholders, and a framework for generating the regional questions.

From what we discussed yesterday the current dilemma facing the team is something like:

We want to involve all Queenslanders to shape the 20 year vision for Qld. We seek input from them on their aspirations and to determine the key areas of focus that will realize those aspirations. The input needs to be strategic enough to inform policy, but pragmatic enough that all can see a link to Queensland and their regions future. We would like to avoid a shopping list of tasks that Govt alone must do. Ownership of the result by all stakeholders is crucial, and the output must be realistic and useable. We would like to develop a few questions that will elicit the type of input that will be really helpful to MP's, Ministers, Public service and other organisations in informing vision, strategy, policy and action. etc, etc

ie "What 2 or 3 questions will stimulate and generate discussion and creative and innovative ideas defining a 20 year vision for Qld, that is do-able together thru a process of Govt as facilitator, and that tackles the future opportunities and challenges?"

We suggest running an iterative process where a set of draft questions are generated (like the "leading questions" from yesterday's notes eg "To live in Queensland is to...", "What is your lifestyle like in 2030?") and cascaded thru the stakeholders as soon as practicable for each group to consider.

"These are the suggested focused questions in response to the dilemma. Do they make sense? How should we change them to get the outcomes we seek?"

The groups to involve would need to include those below(there are plans to engage each anyway), and we could tailor the above request to each as per below:

- Premier (will these deliver the outcome you seek?)

- Ministers (to what extent do these questions link sufficiently to your portfolio's biggest challenges about the future, where you are unclear about the solutions, and could use help to get better solutions?)
- MP's (how well will these questions invite your constituents to engage in the proposed activities energetically ie to come with an open mind willing to find answers together?, how would such questions resonate in areas disaster affected?, to what extent will these questions draw in the disaffected eg Unions)
- DGs (will these questions elicit priorities and directions that we can act upon in our areas of responsibility)
- External groups (do these questions allow and stimulate useful input on the the key areas that matter to them?)
- April workshop participants (do these questions make sense and stimulate them to discuss the opportunities for Qld?, would they be able to see their input in the eventual plan?)

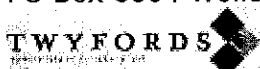

Hi Michael

Please find attached the reworked alternative in line with Premiers advice.

John and I had a chat this evening after we spoke and while we appreciate financial constraints, and desires for shorter timeframe, here is what we see as some of the risks.

* abbreviated process increases the risk of the process not being sufficiently owned to be supported or be regarded as meaning at local level.

* much will depend on the MPs willingness, awareness and confidence to effectively sponsor local processes - therefore there is a risk they will merely go through the motions, choose not to play, or perhaps even worse, go ahead with energy but not wisdom (a little knowledge can be a dangerous thing as we know)

* The CG model rests on the extent to which there is commitment to the process up front - we have a very tight timeframe to help MPs be ready for the Summit

We see the need for more intensive support earlier to get MPs ready, and as we know some MPs are preoccupied with flood impacts and may not see this as being as relevant at this time.

We believe we can work with financial tighter budget, and condensed timeframe provided MPs are sufficiently well prepared and believe in the merit of the process. Failure to achieve this will probably lead to criticisms of the process being a talk fest, insincere or at best, just poorly thought through.

John will provide some more thoughts in the morning. He has just returned from Brisbane and tomorrow is his last day before he heads overseas on leave.

Hi Michael

Thanks for the update on suggested changes to process logistics and timing from your meeting with Kate and Kylie.

The framework of the collaborative design is underpinned by a couple of key principles that we believe are fundamental to get the buy-in and a solution that is truly grass roots, implementable and owned by the stakeholders.

1. The smart leaders "I don't know" approach (ie we need help to get this right) rather than the expert approach (we have this all worked out- just listen to what we say).
2. Appreciative focus- demonstrated Govt belief that those they seek help from are confident, capable and (with support and information) are able to generate solutions and take responsibility for delivering those solutions.

We know that working as much as possible to these principles in the proposed activities is the key to generating the commitment from those involved to participate in the co-define/co-design, and then deliver the outcomes sought by the Premier.

This allows the process to both test and then accomodate the issues raised and changes suggested. Any changes should not compromise the core principles of the collaborative framework, and then risk the core intent of really engaging Queenslanders.

So what does that mean for the plan?

- At each stage (from as early as possible!), seeking help from the appropriate stakeholders in the decisions that need to be made, and keeping the process as open as practicable (consistent with the needs of certainty around dates, numbers, venues, etc) For example:
 - For 26th Feb, message is consistent around the need for help, don't know all details, working it out with you (both questions and the way we engage)
 - For April summit, seek advice from MP's and their volunteers re the cost/time dilemma ie we want a long day, but constrained by budget given current circumstances- how could we get more time cost effectively?
 - For electorate events, set principles for the "signature event" rather than specify activity and makeup ie high profile, right people, etc and ask the group to come up with their recommendation
- Acknowledge the key role of MP's as the sponsors and key resource, and develop an intensive support process to develop awareness, willingness and confidence to participate in the co-define, sponsor the ongoing conversation and local processes. For example:
 - provide them details as early as possible about what is going on (prior to planned March 6th workshop ie treat them as special, acknowledge their capability and invite them into the process)
 - set up a process for their participation in co-defining the questions (see previous advice to you below)

- Set up interactive workshop on 6th March so they participate in conversation rather than be informed of the solution- appreciating them as planners and invite them into the design
- Set up intensive process to build their capacity between 6th March and April summit- eg involving Ministers as mentors for groups of MP's, small workshops or coaching, setup support network with facilitators, etc
- Provide adequate support- eg skilled facilitators, resources, etc for the April summit and preparation
- Acknowledge the public service as a key powerful and valuable asset and invite them similarly into the co-define/co-design process. For example:
 - Brief DG's group - acknowledge value, test and seek input to process
 - Invite and support public service representatives as resources for MP's in the capacity building prior to and at Summit, and ongoing.

We will work through the details of how to build this in to the plan if this makes sense.

I am around a bit today (mostly packing and getting family ready to go!), and Max would be available later if you would like to discuss.

Co-defining the questions

Max and I have given some thought to a process around the co-define element, seeking a balance between providing certainty and a framework, without providing the answer. It could start immediately, and run in a number of iterations until the April event.

The value is the opportunity for careful consideration by each group (eg, Cabinet, MPs, opposition/independent MPs, DGs) of what is intended, and the generation of the draft focus questions by listening to all the key perspectives, and providing a context for those questions (ie, we are not going in with a blank canvass). So we go into the April workshop with some well tested Queensland wide focus questions for validation by the representative stakeholders, and a framework for generating the regional questions.

From what we discussed yesterday the current dilemma facing the team is something like:

We want to involve all Queenslanders to shape the 20 year vision for Qld. We seek input from them on their aspirations and to determine the key areas of focus that will realize those aspirations. The input needs to be strategic enough to inform policy, but pragmatic enough that all can see a link to Queensland's and their regions future. We would like to avoid a shopping list of tasks that Govt alone must do. Ownership of the result by all stakeholders is crucial, and the output must be realistic and useable.

We would like to develop a few questions that will elicit the type of input that will be really helpful to MP's, Ministers, Public service and other organisations in informing vision, strategy, policy and action.
etc, etc

ie "What 2 or 3 questions will stimulate and generate discussion and creative and innovative ideas defining a 20 year vision for Qld, that is do-able together thru a process of Govt as facilitator, and that tackles the future opportunities and challenges?"

We suggest running an iterative process where a set of draft questions are generated (like the "leading questions" from yesterday's notes eg "To live in Queensland is to...", "What is your lifestyle like in 2030?") and cascaded thru the stakeholders as soon as practicable for each group to consider.

"These are the suggested focused questions in response to the dilemma. Do they make sense? How should we change them to get the outcomes we seek?"

The groups to involve would need to include those below(there are plans to engage each anyway), and we could tailor the above request to each as per below:

- Premier (will these deliver the outcome you seek?)

- Ministers (to what extent do these questions link sufficiently to your portfolio's biggest challenges about the future, where you are unclear about the solutions, and could use help to get better solutions?)
- MP's (how well will these questions invite your constituents to engage in the proposed activities energetically ie to come with an open mind willing to find answers together?, how would such questions resonate in areas disaster affected?, to what extent will these questions draw in the disaffected eg Unions)
- DGs (will these questions elicit priorities and directions that we can act upon in our areas of responsibility)
- External groups (do these questions allow and stimulate useful input on the the key areas that matter to them?)
- April workshop participants (do these questions make sense and stimulate them to discuss the opportunities for Qld?, would they be able to see their input in the eventual plan?)

This should facilitate the co-define element in a manageable way, and also will help build ownership and commitment with the key champions as they experience the process of being invited into the decision making.

As discussed, key points of feedback from my discussion this evening with the Premier's Chief of Staff and Deputy Chief of Staff. I'll send a more detailed email ASAP to the larger group.

1. Timeframe - "long term, 20-30 year vision". Rename project as "Queensland 2040".
2. Launch of vision and supporting documents - late November. Means second summit needs to be brought forward to August. No concerns with the second summit being during Federal election campaign. Also means truncated timeframes for grassroots engagement phase.
3. first summit - to be ~400-500 participants (600 max) in regional city, preference for Mackay otherwise Rockhampton. Still do in April. Preference for a Saturday and for a late start and early finish to allow as many as possible to fly in and out in the same day. (We will check Mackay/Rockhampton venue availabilities and capacities and flight times - not as many flights on a weekend). No dinner or breakfast. MPs to invite local council rep plus community participants to attend with them. (89 electorates X 1 MP + 1 local govt rep + 3 community reps = 445; +4 community reps = 534). MPs to run advertisements (MPs to have choice whether to advertise via usual electorate newsletters or local papers. Project team to supply template advertisement) after Premier's announcement 26 Feb and pre-summit to call for general public in their electorate to nominate to attend Summit. MPs to be provided with principles/criteria to inform their selection of community reps. Open to city/regional approach for larger local govt areas. OK for peaks to not attend first summit if pre-briefing to them about process and inviting them to run parallel engagement processes within their sector to also feed in their members' views.
4. Local engagement phase - want one keynote event organized by MP (or local govt as back up if MP won't accept invitation to be involved) in each electorate attended by a Minister with a professional facilitator and a member of project team in attendance to record/scribe. MPs to be encouraged to do other engagement activities. Direct feedback to central email, postal address, online and reply paid survives, reply paid postcards, etc as much as possible for project team to capture input.
5. second summit - Open to second summit being larger number of participants. preference to hold it in Brisbane. Ditto re late start and early finish.
6. MPs briefing. No MP briefing session before Premier's 26 Feb announcement. On day of announcement, the following to be emailed to all MPs (for ALP and KAP, through their Parliamentary leaders) letter inviting MPs to be involved and to attend a 6 March briefing session at Parliament House (or to send delegate if MP not available) plus Premier's media statement, FAQs. Can you please make yourself available to attend the 6 March briefing session - will be in the morning.
7. Cabinet 11 Feb - proceeding with Oral submission and presentation for Minister Powell to talk through. Need to amend and finalist briefing package tomorrow night at latest.

As discussed, can you please develop a fourth page for the PowerPoint presentation that outlines a modified community engagement process based on the above timeframes, which we can consider presenting as an alternative option if Nov 2013 announcement and 500 first Summit participants.

Recruitment of Summit Participants

MPs are being requested to bring along 3-4 other individuals to help design the engagement process in their electorates. The aim is for these people to represent diverse views, and offer their ideas, connections, and experience to the process.

Criteria

- Must not be seen as being 'mates' of MPs
- Should have good knowledge of community events and opportunities for engagement.
- Should be seen as credible people by the broader public.
- Desirable if they have organizing/planning skills.
- Need to be willing to work with others to design a suitable process.
- At least one person from Local Government or relevant Regional Organisation of Councils.
- As a team, are seen as a microcosm of broader electorate in terms of geography, profession, gender and ethnicity (not possible to do it perfectly, but not a good look if we have 4 men aged between 50 and 60 who live in the same town/suburb, for instance)

Options for Recruiting

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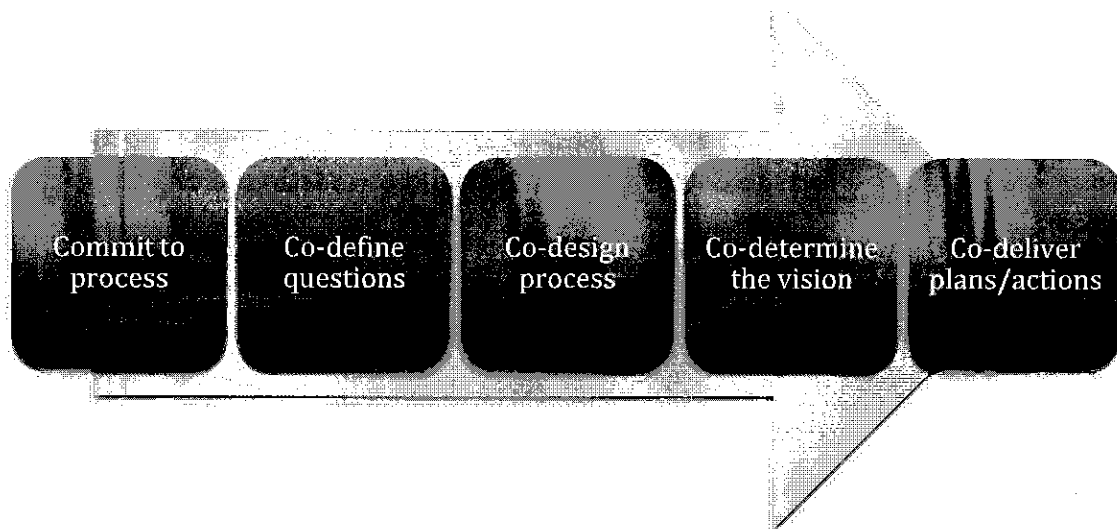
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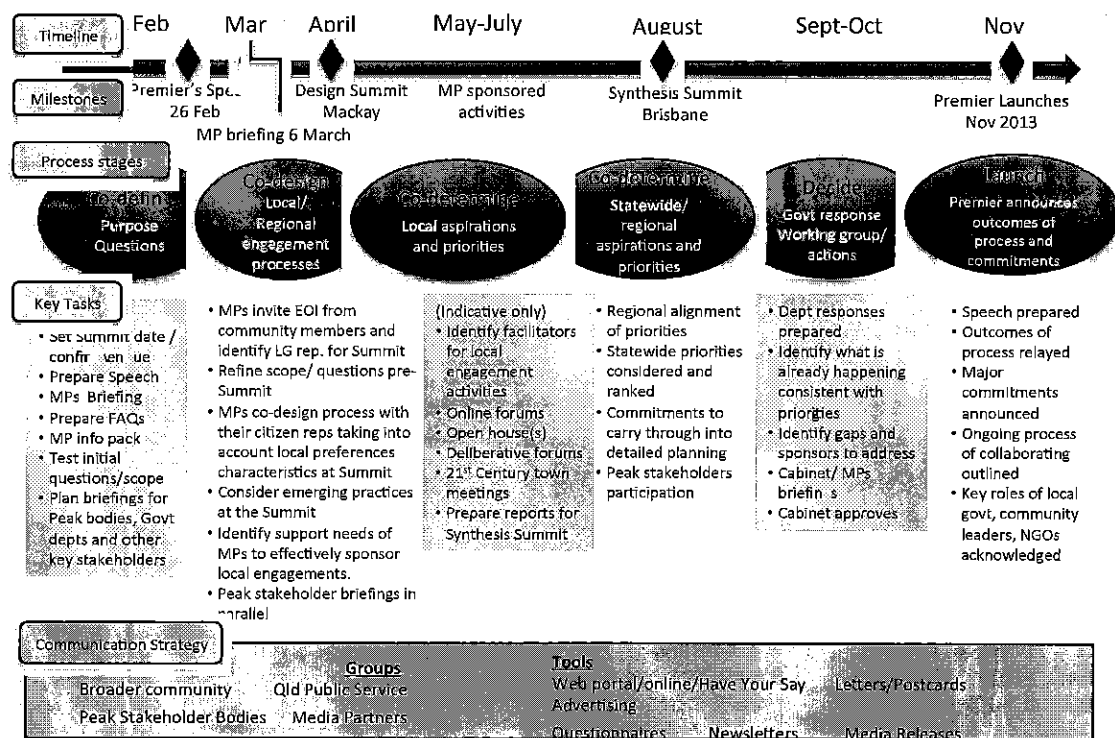

2. A lighter touch alternative option to the currently proposed letters and briefings to MPs on Monday next week – i.e. being a “heads up” notice in advance of any announcement with an invitation for them to be involved, and a promise to provide more information to them and discuss in detail following the Premier’s announcement.

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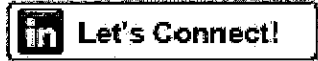

Thanks Max. So if the direction is ~ 400, then we need to take some time to rethink the co-define/co-design process re design of the first summit, which may or may not have flow on implications for the next phase.

Re affordability – the difference in venue hire etc between a 400 vs 800-900 size event is negligible. The real cost difference will arise due to financial support for participants re travel, accommodation, etc. We could explore alternative ways to fund/manage this.

A 400 size event will reduce the number of ordinary Queenslanders and members of the public that will be able to be involved in the event - will leave a max ~300 for non-MPs. We need to avoid/manage criticisms that have plagued some previous summits as being top-down, invite-only, usual suspects, elites, etc. We will also need to ensure we do not undermine the role of MPs as sponsors/facilitators for the co-define/co-design for the grassroots community engagement process in their electorate – and also the important role of local governments in the engagement process.

It make facilitation and design of the day more challenging, but rather than a regional approach for the entire summit, what about just for those MPs and electorates within the larger city councils areas? E.g. use a region/council-centric rather than electorate-centric approach to these bigger council regions? E.g. One table each for the Gold Coast City, Logan City, Redlands, Moreton Bay, Ipswich, Sunshine Coast, Cairns, Townsville, but may need 2-5 tables for Brisbane City itself because of the volume of electorates e.g. Brisbane into five Brisbane North, East, South, West and Central tables (or just 2 - Brisbane north and south)? Perhaps an alternative approach to add to the thinking and mix to test with some MPs following a steer from the Premier?

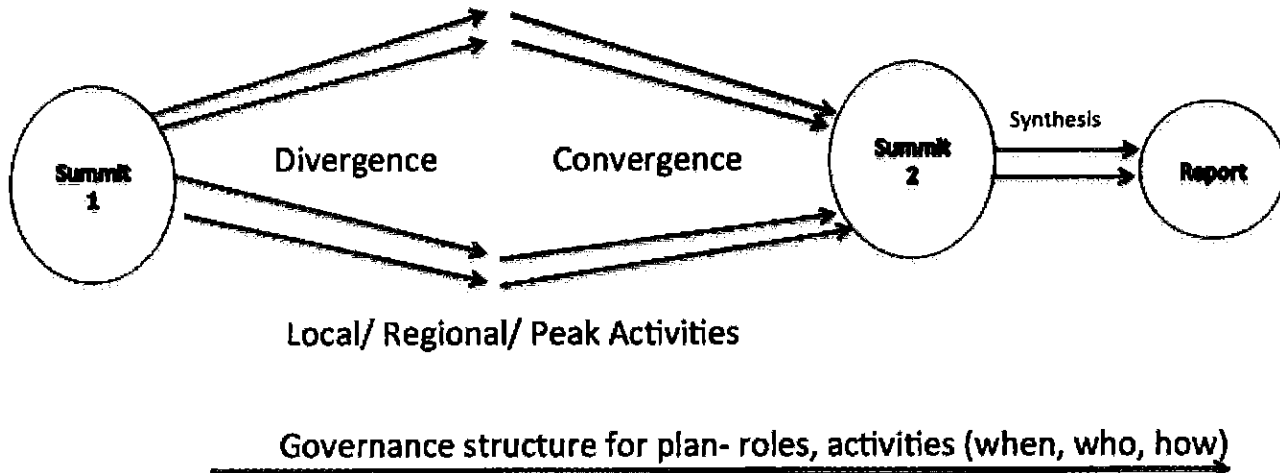
In addition to the current actions re the pending events, we would like to take the opportunity to review the bigger picture to ensure the planning is consistent with the agreed co-define/co-design approach.

Some of the key considerations include:

- whole of Govt approach and ensuring the Public sector is part of the overall process (with emphasis more on process and not content so consistent with the grass roots philosophy, but also making it an inclusive process)
- ensure continuing congruence of the actions and messages from MP's, advisers, DPC and other govt staff, Mayors, etc
- Providing a responsive and solid support network for the local electorate activities - eg local resource person, MP support, resources- materials, information, past work of public sector, etc
- Clarity around governance for the planning process - including who, when and how of project decision making in development of the content

- Clarity around the process for data consolidation, analysis, synthesis and sense making, including how the public might be part of that process

As a key step, we would suggest that the team consider an overall decision making "map" to help firm up the series of activities and resources needed to develop the vision and subsequent planning ie



This obviously links to the current work in securing the tools to consolidate the data, but is more focused on the who, when and how.

Having such a framework will be very useful in providing clarity and confidence to stakeholders at the forthcoming events about how their input will be used (especially as the message is Queenslanders creating the plan for Queensland!)

On 10 May 2013, more than 400 people from across Queensland will gather in Mackay to discuss how *The Queensland Plan* will help shape Queensland's future. Delegates will consider major trends likely to affect our state and identify what issues we need to discuss in our electorates to develop our long-term vision.

Who will be there?

A cross section of Queenslanders from across the state, from varied backgrounds and workplaces, from those just starting out to those with decades of experience, will join together at the Mackay Summit. So whether you are a community worker, a small business owner, a grandmother or an experienced politician – everyone will have an opportunity to have their say in shaping Queensland's future. Each Member of Parliament has been invited to attend the summit along with three community representatives from their electorate. All Queensland Mayors have also been invited to attend.

What will I need to do?

Delegates may have never participated in such a forum before, or they may be community leaders with substantial experience in future planning. We will provide a range of materials to delegates prior to the Summit, including future trends and issues facing Queensland. This information will also be available on the website. Take the time to reflect on your vision for Queensland, and then consider these trends, and how they could shape our future plan.

How will it work?

The summit will include three sessions:

- What is a long-term vision, how do we prepare for the future and what challenges and opportunities are facing Queensland over the next 30 years?
- What questions do we need to ask Queenslanders on both a local and statewide level to help shape how we respond to the future?
- How can we engage our communities to discuss these issues and respond to the questions?

Delegates will work in both electorate and thematic groups to discuss issues and prepare questions.

Next steps

The Mackay Summit is just the beginning of the process. Over the following three months, community engagement activities will take place in each electorate to facilitate local conversations about Queensland's future. All Queenslanders will be invited to have their say and respond to the questions whether by attending local community events, joining a focus group or completing an online survey.

Each Member of Parliament will collate their electorate feedback and submit to The Queensland Plan Project Team. This information will be compiled with feedback from Queenslanders via a statewide online survey.

A second summit will be held in Brisbane on 9 October 2013 to discuss Queensland's collective response to the questions and determine how this information will inform *The Queensland Plan*. The summit outcomes will direct the draft plan which will be released in late 2013.

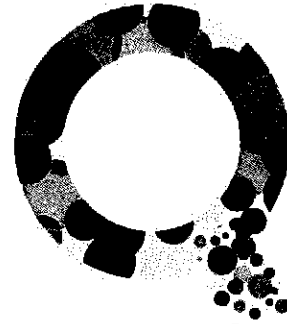

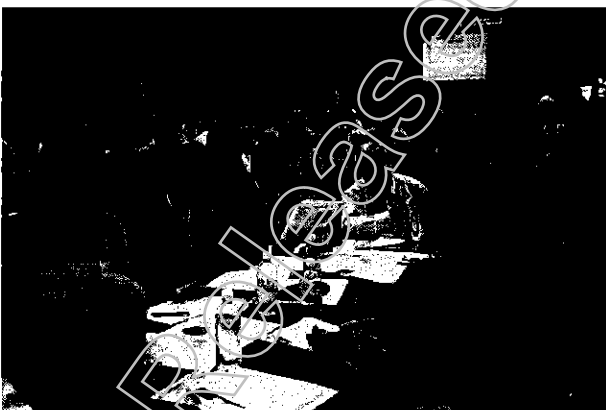
The Queensland Plan will be our shared vision for where we want our state to be in 30 years. It will be created by Queenslanders, for Queenslanders. Its development is the first of its kind in scope and scale in our state, and will be a genuine reflection of our collective aspirations and priorities for the future.

On Friday 10 May 2013, more than 400 Queenslanders from all parts of the state came together for *The Queensland Plan* Mackay Summit to workshop the challenges and opportunities we need to address to create a vision for Queensland. Through these workshops, six questions were developed collaboratively by the delegates. Answers to these questions will be used to guide development of *The Queensland Plan*.

This document includes the raw data collected at the Mackay Summit, including short-listed questions, table notes, suggestions provided to facilitators regarding local community engagement and other information. A summary report of the attendees, activities and outcomes from the Mackay Summit is also available at www.qld.gov.au/queenslandplan.

The people

The Mackay Summit was attended by delegates from every Queensland electorate (refer to *Appendix 1* for list of professions), Members of Parliament (refer to *Appendix 2* for full list), Mayoral Representatives (refer to *Appendix 3* for full list), a youth delegation (refer to *Appendix 4* for list of schools and youth groups), and accredited media (refer to *Appendix 5* for list). The summit had bipartisan support, and featured representation across diverse backgrounds covering community groups, sporting organisations, business, Indigenous, youth, multicultural and disability sectors.

Table exercise one

Working in electorate groups, discuss at your tables:

- From your experience and information presented today what do you believe are the key opportunities and challenges facing Queensland?
- What questions would you ask in your electorate or region?

Tasks

- Write down the top three questions from your table electorate group on the butchers paper provided.
- Choose what you think is your best question, write it on a sheet provided and post to the sticky wall.

Appendix 6 provides the raw data of the best questions from each electorate, as written by the electorate representatives and placed on the sticky wall.

Appendix 7 provides additional questions proposed by some electorates and made available to facilitators on butchers paper or other documentation on the day.

Table exercise two

Following table exercise one, delegates were randomly regrouped into five discussion areas to commence a statewide discussion. These groups were:

- Jobs, participating and the economy
- Education and research
- Living in my community
- Sustainable landscapes
- Healthy and active.

It should be noted that these five discussion areas were refined following feedback generated at the Peak Bodies' Workshop (see report at www.qld.gov.au/queenslandplan).

Overview

Tables worked together to craft several questions they believed would engage fellow Queenslanders to contribute to a 30-year vision with regard to their respective discussion area.

Delegates were also asked to nominate any questions that they felt were important to consider in creating the vision that were outside their discussion area on the wildcard wall.

Tasks

- Generate a few questions for your discussion area.
- Identify your top two questions for your table.
- If you have another question unrelated to your discussion area, post it on the wildcard wall.
- Work with neighbouring table to craft your best single question for your discussion area.
- Write your best question on the sheet provided and post it to the wall.

Appendix 8 provides the raw data of the five best questions proposed by each discussion area and placed on the sticky wall for voting, and wildcard questions that were posed. It also includes the number of votes received by each question, as voted by the delegates.

Voting

Delegates individually voted for their favourite question in each of the discussion areas (using five sticky dots). They also visited the wildcard question area and voted for a wildcard question if they felt it was important for the conversation about the future.

Editorial committee

An editorial group was randomly selected to review the statewide questions from each discussion area that received the highest number of votes, as well as the wildcard questions with the greatest number of votes.

The editorial committee considered:

- consistency of language and question framework
- cohesion of all six questions as a complete set
- removal of any duplication to simplify and clarify
- easy understanding of the intention behind the questions.

The editorial group was chaired by Max Hardy, facilitator from Twyford, and Andrew Chesterman, Director General, Department of Environment and Heritage Protection. Five random table numbers were electronically selected and then the chosen table selected a delegate to join the editorial group who met the following criteria:

- not an elected representative
- good with words
- quick thinker and worker
- willing to work with others to reach agreement
- team player.

The six questions—developed by Queenslanders

- In the context of living in the community, how do we move our focus from me to we?
- How do we create and foster an education culture that teaches skills and values to meet global challenges and optimise regional strengths?
- How do we empower and educate individuals, communities and institutions to embrace responsibility for an active and healthy lifestyle?
- How do we structure our economy to ensure our children inherit a resilient future?
- How do we strengthen our economic future and achieve sustainable landscapes?
- How do we attract and retain the brightest minds and ideas where they are most needed and capitalise on global opportunities?

Table exercise three

While the editorial group finalised the questions, delegates continued with workshops to consider how they could engage with their local community to ensure everyone joins in the conversation about Queensland's future. In considering their options for local community engagement, they completed a number of tasks.

Tasks:

- What works well in your electorate/region?
- Brainstorm ideas.
- Talk it over with some neighbouring tables, does it make sense to do some things together?

- Record the information discussed in your workbook and use to inform your electorate engagement program.

Raw notes and suggestions provided to facilitators are included in *Appendix 9*.

Further working notes collected from tables throughout the day are included in *Appendix 10*.

The next steps

With the questions finalised, the summit wrapped up by noting that all Queenslanders now have this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to have their say on shaping the long-term future of Queensland. Queenslanders are encouraged to join the conversation in their local community or visit *The Queensland Plan* website www.qld.gov.au/queenslandplan to have their say.

Feedback from the community will then be considered at a further summit to be held in Brisbane in early October 2013. The plan will be finalised by the end of the year.

BUILDING better family relationships and improving medical services will be put front and centre of the Queensland Plan.

Representatives from across the state will travel to Mackay next month to put their vision for the

future to political leaders as part of the Queensland Plan summit.

Social justice advocate Florence Onus, builder and former North Queensland Cowboys player Martin Locke and Dr Patrick Gibney have been selected by the Townsville Bulletin to attend the summit and represent the electorates of Townsville, Thuringowa and Mundingburra.

Both Ms Onus and Mr Locke want more emphasis placed on improving family relationships in an attempt to break the cycle of youth crime in Townsville.

Ms Onus wants the State Government to consider creating family wellbeing centres, to act as a one-stop shop for people to access social service and life skills.

"These wellbeing centres would provide education in these sorts of basic life and parenting skills as well as being a place where people can go to get referred to other services," she said.

Mr Locke said he wanted to ensure teenage boys and adolescent men had access to quality mentors.

"The reason we have such bad crime problems is these boys aren't taught to be men by their fathers, instead they think being a man is about stealing the best car," he said.

Dr Gibney wants to ensure North Queensland gets the resources to train and retain high-quality medical professionals in the region.

"Townsville has always had a history of training great doctors, the problem is retaining them," he said.

"And a huge part of that is keeping the pathology lab at Townsville Hospital in government hands."

All three Townsville-based state MPs chose two representatives from their local communities to attend the conference.

Thuringowa MP Sam Cox has selected Chamber of Commerce executive officer Marie-Claude Brown and Townsville City councillor Gary Eddiehausen.

Mundingburra MP David Crisafulli invited small business owner and Townsville Triathlon founder Jaret Grant and life member of Townsville and District Senior Rugby League Midge Jackson to attend.

Townsville MP John Hathaway has chosen MASSICK director and former army reserve Colonel Mick Reilly and geoscience researcher and James Cook University lecturer Dr Maree Corkeron.

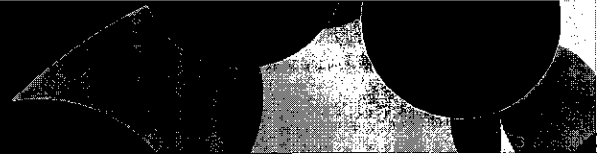

Summary of the peak body briefing workshop – 30 April 2013

More than 140 organisations from peak bodies across Queensland gathered on Tuesday 30 April 2013 to discuss the long-term future of Queensland, and shape some ideas around what Queensland could look like in 30 years.

The workshop was one of the first activities associated with *The Queensland Plan*, and was designed to inform the Mackay Summit, a meeting of more than 400 Queenslanders, on 10 May 2013.

Workshop attendees looked at what areas of discussion might help Queenslanders to focus on when talking about a 30 year vision. Following on from this, attendees workshopped different questions we could ask Queenslanders to get these conversations started.

Key points raised at the briefing workshop include:

- highlighted need for clearer discussion areas to be used when developing the questions
- suggestions to refine the scope of discussion areas
- advice on how to ensure the engagement process for the development of *The Queensland Plan* is as inclusive as possible.

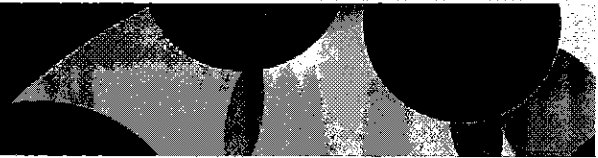

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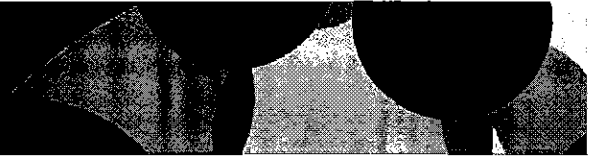


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2. Recorded Feedback

Activity 1 – Focusing the vision

Workshop delegates were asked which key discussion areas to cover when considering Queensland's future. Five draft discussion areas were provided as a framework for the discussion:

Delegate feedback

- Lifestyle: could be expanded to include "sense of community", for example, it is arguable that if 11 votes had been held to de-amalgamate local government, instead of "Living and lifestyle" all would have been "yes" as communities are keen to maintain their own identity.

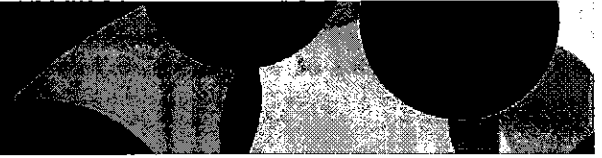
Action: Are there any glaring omissions or jarring terms?

Delegate feedback

- They are very broad areas, it's hard to be clear on what is included and where some topics sit, especially those that may fit across a range of topics e.g. IT/Infrastructure (The Enablers). Broad topics mean different things to different people
- Is there a need for a descriptive or intent statement?
- Is missing values framework
- Value on how communities are constructed so they are flourishing and vibrant
- Green terms a bit too nebulous perhaps opposite the issue
- "Healthy and active" and "Living and lifestyle" quite similar
- "Living and lifestyle" and "Safe and green communities" doesn't resonate
- Missing resilience and connectedness with community
- Need to be aware that in 30 years' time these should be entrenched in societal values
- Green too nebulous
- "Living and lifestyle" – prefer "Lifestyle and community engagement"
- Work instead of Jobs
- "Green" – no other items have descriptors
- "Safe" – no other items have descriptors
- Disconnect between megatrends and areas of discussion.

Additional activity – Feedback on the process

Workshop delegates were asked to provide feedback on the previous activities and processes, to inform planning for similar activities at the Mackay Summit.

Action: What worked well with the activities? What could be improved if it was run again?

Delegate feedback

- Small groups are good (4 or 5)
- Diverse backgrounds in the group are good
- A clear focus for questions is very good
- Watch balance between high order principles verses long term and concrete relevance
- Diversity of input (ensures robustness of result)

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- Thoroughness of research/preparation
- Language used in framing questions
- Don't underestimate people
- Don't make it too simple/simplistic
- What values do we have/want to guide future decisions?
- Participants want to contribute – how to capture this input
- Provide a little more context to enable participation to better form questions e.g. exploration of megatrends and why the issues are important
- The topic is a given (i.e. everyone wants to be healthy) so this wasn't controversial, but others might be
- Participants will want to give 'their' answers or 'fixes' – perhaps suggest that, use this to come back to global question
- Random allocation of participants to topics (by coloured dots) was good (effective)
- Timing was reasonable
- Would be helpful to have 'good' question examples left up on screen or on paper on table
- Should people/communities be incentivised for having improved health outcomes?
- But do we really need to be asking this? This needs more work as one of the five themes "Healthy and Active"
- Reference – SEQ Catchments Report 2010 "Managing what matters" – for how SEQ members of the community value our environment.
- Define the topics
- Give attendees background papers so people know the context – if not people will disengage
- Tailor expertise of general public to the focus areas
- Allow people to give their specific knowledge – self select pointed questions
- Diversify the crowd – make sure everyone is represented – more youth
- Prioritise the face to face mechanism for consultation
- Keep questions interesting, but not too layered
- Mix – representing own interests – end up with expert questions
- Criteria – ill defined – then defined
- Narrow focus
- Keep the group diverse and largely unknown.
- Need to ensure that tables are made up of different constituencies i.e. Herberton, Toowoomba, Mt Isa, not SE Qld together, NW Qld etc.
- Each group needs a moderator to ensure no one view/agenda dominates the discussion
- More multicultural representatives, need to include all demographics e.g. youth
- Context behind subject matter
 - forecasts etc. e.g. population to double
 - Global megatrends – regional focus: what does it mean for Queensland?
- What are the 'probable' opportunities and challenges?
- Maintain state wide focus (not SEQ)
- Review where we've come from in 30 years
- Specific skills and expertise
 - diverse background good, but needs representation by an 'expert' in the content/area
- Getting the diversity of input and different perspectives – culturally and geographically i.e. make up of group
- 5 areas – have the group/Queenslanders come up with these, downside – would need more time.
- Remind participants that in framing questions to remember who the end audience is and to avoid buzz words/jargon – keep it simple and broad
- Make time for discussion activity 1 to get the wording of the key areas right

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- Use why/what/how/is?
- K.I.S.S. – keep it simple stupid
